

# Bee project launched in Tibati

That the debate about looted cultural property is not just about restitutions is demonstrated by a bee project that has now started in Cameroon. After the Lamido of Tibati visited Bremen in the fall of 2022 to discuss the future of the 150 or so objects looted from Tibati in the Übersee-Museum's collection, the desire for cooperation became clear. In planning with the city and the University of Bremen are several agricultural projects, one of which has now been launched with funds from the "Rest-Cent" campaign: the bee initiative of Dr. Mazi Sanda.

He has been researching honey production in northern Cameroon for some time and guides the beekeepers there. Through adapting traditional technologies, training beekeepers and the resulting increase in the quality and quantity of the honey, the value chain can be improved significantly. In view of climate change, the sustainable development of beekeeping is also taken into account. This is an important pillar of Cameroon's agricultural economy and an important source of income for a large part of the local population.



# OBJECT ON STRIKE!

#### **My favourite object** Malte Hampe, Head of Carpenter at the Übersee-Museum

Moin! My name is Malte Hampe. As head of the carpenter at the museum, I am very familiar with our exhibitions and the exhibits. Despite the sheer number of possibilities, it was easy for me to choose my favourite object: The coast redwood is a true wonder of nature and has fascinated me ever since I was a child. Back then, I could hardly believe that trees could grow so big and be so old! This tree originated around 370 BC and lived to be over 2,300 years old. The slice of the trunk, which is on display in the permanent exhibition "What makes the world go round" impresses with a diameter of around 4.5 meters. Nowadays, I walk past it almost every day and cannot help but look at it every time. It reminds me how tiny and insignificant we humans are compared to such a natural wonder. This tree has witnessed so many thousands of years of earth's history and we are only a small part of it – I wonder how the person who felled this tree thought about it.

The Übersee-Museum focuses on the diversity of life, coexistence and perspectives on our world. Unique exhibitions of cultural history, masterful animal dioramas and real plants invite you to marvel. The visit takes you from Asia with its legendary Silk Road to the African savannah to the Americas. The exhibitions do not follow a set itinerary – visitors are invited to freely explore the museum.

Many museum treasures from the collection, which is unique in Europe, as well as the neighbouring visible storage "Übermaxx", are waiting to be explored. In the exhibition "Tracking the Past" the museum takes a critical look at its colonial past. Until winter 2024/2025, a new Oceania exhibition about life in the Pacific Rim is being built. For a lingering break, visit the koi pond and enjoy the tranquil atmosphere. Strengthen yourself with food you brought in our Africa Café, in the picnic corner or round off your visit to the museum in the Restaurant "Übersee".

# Buddhism

Buddhism is one of the great religious traditions of humankind. Meditation, mindfulness, yoga – many Buddhist practices have found their way into our everyday life. However, where did Buddhism begin? How did it spread throughout the world and what is the attraction for Western audiences? Based on around 250 objects from the museum's collection, the special exhibition "Buddhism" explores the unbroken fascination for this world religion. From magnificent Buddha figures, elaborately constructed textiles to ritual objects: Visitors can expect extraordinary highlights from Myanmar, Thailand, the Silk Road region, China, Japan and Tibet.

On the journey through the world of Buddhism, visitors will experience the memorable events of the night of Buddha's awakening, immerse themselves in the meditative atmosphere of a Zen garden or marvel at the monumental sacred sites that have shaped the history of Buddhism.

# **Digi ... What? –** From the depot to the digital world

Digitization does not stop at the museums door: The Übersee-Museum is also working on digitizing its collections and making them accessible online for everyone. Not an easy task with over 1 million objects in the natural history department alone! This important work is mostly hidden and hardly noticed by the public. With the cabinet exhibition "Digi ... What?" the Übersee-Museum is making its collection work visible and invites visitors to look behind the scenes. At set times, natural history objects are digitized live in the exhibit. At the same time, the public can engage in conversation with the staff. How does the digitization of the objects work? What equipment and technologies are used? What challenges do the employees face and where are the opportunities for the daily museum work? What will the museum of the future look like? Visitors can get to the bottom of these questions and marvel at the first results of digitization at an explorative media table.
